Leeds students have raised over $\pounds 10,000$ for the earthquake and Tsunami relief fund with a series of events.

The recent Lantern Reflection event saw students light up the Terrace Bar with paper lanterns inscribed in Japanese calligraphy with the name of the purchaser. Students could also buy home-made Japanese food, and leave messages of support on a board that will be sent to the the region, with the event raising £863.
